

#### act Flow

#### 1. Welcome and Introduction

- Introduction: Welcome participants and introduce the concept of working with recycled leather. Explain the environmental benefits of using recycled materials and how leather scraps can be transformed into beautiful, functional accessories.
   Discuss the types of projects participants can choose from, such as keychains, wallets, or pouches.
- **Engagement**: Invite participants to share why they are interested in leatherworking or upcycling. This helps set the tone for a collaborative, creative session.
- **Duration**: 10 minutes

#### 2. Overview of Tools and Materials

• **Explanation**: Provide an overview of the leatherworking tools (such as leather scissors, needles, waxed thread, hole punches, and edge bevellers) and the different types of recycled leather pieces participants will be working with.



- Sustainability Focus: Highlight how the act of upcycling leather scraps reduces
  waste and supports sustainability, making this project both creative and
  environmentally friendly.
- Purpose: This section introduces participants to the essential tools and materials, ensuring they feel confident in working with leather.

• **Duration**: 10 minutes

#### 3. Project Planning: Design and Cutting

- Design Choices: Help participants decide what accessory they want to make (keychain, wallet, or pouch). Offer simple design templates or allow them to sketch their own.
- Cutting the Leather: Demonstrate how to safely cut the leather according to the template. Emphasize the importance of precision and show participants how to handle leather scissors for clean, smooth cuts.
- Purpose: This step encourages participants to get hands-on and creative, focusing on the design and basic leatherworking skills.

• **Duration**: 20–30 minutes

## 4. Stitching and Assembling

- Stitching Techniques: Teach participants basic stitching techniques, such as saddle stitching, to assemble their leather pieces. Show them how to punch holes evenly for stitching and how to use waxed thread for durability.
- **Assembling the Pieces**: Guide participants in assembling their keychain, wallet, or pouch, ensuring they follow the template and pay attention to detail in their stitching.
- **Purpose**: Participants learn the core skill of stitching, bringing their design to life in this hands-on section.

• **Duration**: 40–50 minutes

#### 5. Finishing Touches and Personalization

• **Edge Finishing**: Demonstrate how to finish the edges of their leather projects using an edge beveller or burnishing tool, giving the item a polished, professional look.



- Optional Personalization: Offer tools for adding personal touches, such as stamping initials, adding decorative stitching, or attaching small embellishments.
- Purpose: Personalization helps participants create a unique, one-of-a-kind accessory, making the act even more rewarding.

• **Duration**: 15–20 minutes

#### 6. Group Sharing and Reflection

- Sharing Time: Invite participants to share their finished products with the group. Ask
  them to reflect on the process—how did they enjoy working with recycled leather?
  What skills did they feel most proud of learning?
- Closing Remarks: Thank participants for their creativity and encourage them to continue exploring leatherworking and upcycling in their personal projects. Offer resources for further learning or provide ideas for advanced classes.
- **Duration**: 10–15 minutes

## act Participants

#### Who is this act for?

- Sustainability-focused individuals: People who value eco-friendly, upcycled products and want to learn how to make them themselves.

## **Supplies**

- Recycled Leather Pieces: Pre-cut or scrap leather pieces that participants can use for their projects.
- Leather Scissors: For cutting leather pieces according to the design templates.
- Hole Punches: For making stitching holes in the leather.
- **Needles and Waxed Thread**: For saddle stitching and assembling the leather pieces.

# Pricing
